FOREWORD BY THE GENERAL SECRETARY

I am honored to present NMIFA's Activity Report to the 12th Ordinary Congress. We started 2022 with elevated expectations since we were able to resume normal football activities towards the middle of 2021. Our association was able to conduct all the regular football programs and sustain the growth of the sport notwithstanding the continued ramifications of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Football Association

The AFC youth competitions where our national teams regularly compete resumed in 2022. That was a much-welcomed development for our players, especially the young men, as they looked forward to the AFC U20 and U17 Asian Cup Qualifiers in Amman, Jordan and the upcoming competition in Shepparton, Australia. Under our Technical Director and Head Coaches, the national teams have been training year-round to prepare for high-level competitions. In 2022, the preparations included five training camps in Guam and one in the Philippines, participated by U17, U19, Men's and Women's teams. Even our Junior National Academy comprising of U12 players had a training camp on Guam. NMIFA is grateful to the Guam Football Association and Tuloy Foundation in the Philippines for hosting these training camps.

NMIFA was also able to conduct all the local youth programs in 2022. After the long break due to the pandemic, the young players were looking forward to the resumption of the youth league. Adding to the enthusiasm was the introduction of TakeCare Insurance as the brand sponsor of the youth League. Starting Spring of 2022 the league has been named the NMIFA TakeCare Soccer Youth League. In addition to the Spring and Fall Season, there was also a TakeCare Youth Summer Cup. There have been over 140 teams in age groups from U6 to U16 that had registered in the NMIFA youth leagues.

The youth programs for the schools also continued in 2022. The Interscholastic Soccer League (ISL) for the Middle School and High School Girls had their league from March to April. While ongoing from September to October are the Elementary COED (4th & 5th Graders) and Middle School Boys' leagues. All the matches are now being played at the NMISTC mini pitch. The PE Support Program for elementary schools (1st to 3rd Graders) was also conducted from February to May 2022 with three schools participating.

The adult leagues have also been active throughout the year. The men's committee kicked off the year with a Master's Holiday League in January and then followed that with the Spring Season League from April to June. The Fall Season League is ongoing from September to November 2022. The women's committee had their Dove Women's League Spring Season from March to May and are about to start the Fall Season this October to November.

Northern Mariana Islands

Football Association

NMIFA's Technical Department has been continuously contributing their share for the development of coaches and referees. The shortage of coaches and referees is a major concern for our young association as we still don't have enough individuals in the NMI with the institutional knowledge about football. Therefore, our technical director and senior coaches/referee are regularly conducting certification courses & refresher courses, workshops, assessments, and mentoring to all those willing to learn. NMIFA has also continued implementing the coaching incentive program whereby cash allowances are paid to coaches that attended certification courses and are regularly coaching teams in their respective clubs. Our national team coaches are also devoting time to attend courses to reach higher levels of certification or license. They also take advantage of online seminars and workshops being offered by the technical departments of AFC and other football organizations. We also have current staff members that have or are attending long-term courses (at least six months) that are intended for developing football association administrators. We make it a point to inform our young players that there is 4 growth in football not only by playing but also by being international referees, coaches, coaching instructors, tournament officials, and football organization executives.

NMIFA has been committed to instill the value of social responsibility. It continues to be an active participant in the GCEA-PPP Initiative through volunteer national team players, coaches, and office staff doing regular clean-up and/or trash collection within Koblerville. This same group are also being encouraged and supported by NMIFA to actively participate in fundraising and other activities that promote health and assist the needy sectors of the community.

On March 5, 2022, NMIFA had the groundbreaking ceremony for the expansion of the NMI Soccer Training Center (NMISTC). This \$2 million project is Phase 2 of the training center and will provide another full-size pitch with stadium lighting and bleachers for spectators. Since the number of players are increasing, and the school football league programs are now all being held at the training center, the new pitch can alleviate the shortage of playing venues. It will also allow better scheduling of leagues, tournaments, and other football related activities. Once completed, the expanded training center will be more attractive to sponsors. NMI will be able to market the facility for sports tourism since that was also one of the justifications for building it.

In closing, the NMIFA Executive Committee and I would like to thank all the member clubs, their officers and members, and all the NMIFA officials and staff members, for their hard work and untiring support to continue the development of soccer in the CNMI.

JUNIOR NATIONAL ACADEMY

IMPORTANT EVENTS

GROUNDBREAKING AND EXPANSION OF THE NMISTC (3/5/2022)

On March 5, 2022, the NMI football community watched on as NMIFA officials, Executive Committee members, and local government officials ceremonially broke ground at the expansion site of the NMI Soccer Training Center.



The CNMI local government, through the Department of Public Lands and the Department of Community and Cultural Affairs, granted NMIFA an additional 20,000 square meters of land adjacent to the original lot of the NMI Soccer Training Center. NMIFA was also given an extension to its current lease of the entire property for another 25 years. NMIFA is now in Phase 2 of the NMI Soccer Training Center Project, where the additionally lot will allow for one regular sized pitch and one mini pitch.
