

# NMIFA ORDINARY CONGRESS ACTIVITY REPORT

## FOREWORD FROM GENERAL SECRETARY

The Northern Mariana Islands Football Association's local competitions for youth, men's and women's adults, and students form the core of the NMI soccer program as seen in this Activity Report for the 14th NMIFA Ordinary Congress.

Our TakeCare Youth Soccer League Fall 2023 and Spring 2024 seasons saw some interesting and exciting results as clubs continue to do their best to beef up their pool of young players. The Dove Women's Soccer League showcased the increasing number of female players taking their acts into the pitch, while the Marianas Soccer League 1 and 2 had their own highlights. The Interscholastic Soccer League, on the other hand, continues to provide the NMIFA soccer a strong support to its grassroots program with schools, particularly in the elementary level, fielding multiple teams.

Our players also brought their game outside our home turf with the NMI Men's National Team participating in the Pacific Games for the first time and recording its first win during the 2023 Pacific Games hosted in the Solomon Islands. The NMI Women's National Team went to Zhuhai, China for the Women's EAFF E-1 Football Championships in December 2023, and the NMI U15 Women's were also in China (Dalian) for the East Asian Football Federation U15 Women's Championship 2024 in August.

Alongside these regular local leagues and international tournaments are significant events/activities that go beyond competitions, touching on the continued growth of all aspects of the NMI soccer program and trying to create opportunities for the different stakeholders in the sport and the general public.

These activities included hosting anew the Marianas Cup to strengthen relationship with the Guam Football Association and holding new events—LPK Cup and Women's U21 Three Nations Cup—to build new ties (with Japan's Shonan Bellmare, Tuloy Football Club, Chelsea FC Soccer School Hong Kong, and Mongolian Football Federation).

Fostering strong partnerships locally is as equally important as building relationships internationally and the NMIFA, for the Spring 2024 and Summer 2024 was able to work with local organizations in bringing soccer and its benefits closer to home. The NMIFA partnered with the CNMI Public School System's Athletic Department for the 2024 AFC Grassroots Football Day, bringing together over 500 elementary students and teachers from 7 schools to experience the joy of the game. In the summer, the NMIFA teamed up with the 4-H Marianas in holding the 4-H Magalahi Summer Camp and hosting two sessions of football drills and fun games for more than 400 children.

In the same summer period, the NMIFA welcomed World Cup veteran and Japan's pride Saki Kumagai, who had generously shared her soccer skills to the NMI through a clinic. The 2019 AFC Women's Player of the Year also delivered key messages that were well-received and should serve as an inspiration to everyone.

All these activities and special events were made possible through the continued support of the players' parents, our local and international partners, the various clubs' leaders, coaches, and volunteers, and referees and national coaches, the CNMI Public School System and its Athletics Department, and other members of our community.

Thank you for your continued support through the years and together, we look forward to more achievements and opportunities for NMI soccer.

## NATIONAL TEAM PROGRAM

The NMIFA National Team Program reached a couple of milestones. First on the list was the NMI Men's National Team's participation for the first time in the Pacific Games and the group's first historic win (against American Samoa) in the quadrennial competition hosted in the Solomon Islands from November 17 to December 2 in 2023. Then there's the NMI Women's National Team's pair of victories in the Women's East Asian Football Federation E-1 Football Preliminary Competition in December 2023, and the NMI U21 Women's National Team's reign in the NMI U21 Women's Three Nations Cup in July 2024. International training camps and friendlies also provided players under the NMIFA National Team Program more opportunities to compete and continue their development.

## JUNIOR NATIONAL ACADEMY

Batch 2023-2024 of the Junior National Academy was made up of 29 players (13 girls and 16 boys) and 5 coaches. Selected players underwent twice-a-week training sessions for nearly seven months and culminated the season with the JNA Training Camp that incorporated both on and off the pitch activities. Players had training matches against the NMI U16 National Team Pool, MP United FC U14, and Paire FC U14; held an educational tour at the Northern Marianas College-Cooperative Research, Extension, & Education Service's Aquaculture & Natural Resources (A&NR) at the Center for Aquaculture Development (CAD) and the Center for Agriculture Development Agroforestry Demonstration; and did tree planting in support of the Marianas Visitors Authority's program.





## SCHOOLS OUTREACH

This is the Physical Education Support Program that is supported by the Japan Football Association and caters to girls and boys from first to third grade from both private and public schools. The P.E. Support Program aims to introduce football and encourage student participation beyond school settings. It hopes to boost interest in football at the school level, fostering increased involvement in NMIFA's Junior National Academy and ISL Programs. The program also aims to develop P.E. teachers as football coaches and officials.

For the 2023-2024 School Year P.E. Support Program that ran from March 18, 2024 to May 31, 2024, 636 students from 5 schools benefitted from the outreach program.
